Article 3 - Stockpile destruction and retention

Completed destruction of its cluster munition stockpiles before the Convention entered into force for it

Article 4 - Clearance and risk reduction education

Clearance obligation deadline: 1 March 2022, extended to 1 March 2026

Cleared 1.75 km² in 2021, 5.07 km² in 2022, and 1,02 km² in 2023

Remaining contamination over 9,28 km² located in 4 provinces

Reported decreased donor funding level as the main challenge in the implementation of Article 4

Submitted extension request that was considered at the 2RC Part 2; analysis of the request can be found here

Article 5 - Victim assistance

Has cluster munition victims

National focal point designated

National Disability Prevention and Rehabilitation Plan 2017-2020 being implemented

State Party to Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities since 18 September 2012

Article 6 - International cooperation and assistance

Has requested assistance to fulfil Articles 4 and 5 obligations

Donors in 2023 included: Denmark, Germany, Italy, Japan, Netherlands, Norway, Spain, Sweden, United Kingdom and the United States.

Article 7 - Transparency measures

Initial transparency report submitted on 30 August 2012

Annual reports submitted covering: Annually from 2012 to 2023

Article 9 - National implementation measures

Adopted prohibitions on cluster munitions as <u>Annex no. 1 of Law on Firearms, Ammunition and Explosive Materials</u> in 2018 that includes penal sanctions as required by the CCM and also prohibits investment in cluster munitions
