

# Article 3 - Stockpile destruction and retention

Completed destruction of its cluster munition stockpiles in July 2013

### Article 4 - Clearance and risk reduction education

Clearance obligation deadline: Extended to 1 June 2026

In 2023 it cleared 1.43 km<sup>2</sup>, three remained areas to be cleared: Pampa Chaca Este 17.1 km<sup>2</sup>, Delta 11.3 km<sup>2</sup>, and Barrancas 0,9 km<sup>2</sup>

Passed Ministerial Order No. 2 on the Provision of Activities for Compliance with the CCM

Passed Ministerial Order for the Execution of Military Activities in Compliance with the CCM 2022-2023, which include training of EOD Units, implementing EORE activities, and commencing CMR clearance and destruction in second half of 2023.
