<p>Article 4 - Clearance and risk reduction education</p> <p>Does not have any contamination in areas under its jurisdiction or control</p>		
<p>Article 5 - Victim assistance</p> <p>Does not have cluster munition victims</p>		
<p>Article 6 - International cooperation and assistance</p> <p>Has not provided any information on request or provision of assistance</p>		
<p>Article 7 - Transparency measures</p> <p>Initial transparency report submitted on 14 January 2020</p> <p>Annual report submitted covering: 2020 and 2022</p>		
<p>Article 9 - National implementation measures</p> <p>Existing laws – <i>Criminal Law (Offenses) Act, Explosives Act, Customs Act, Firearms Act, Disability Rights Act and National Insurance and Social Security Act</i> – which include penal sanctions, are considered by Guyana as sufficient to implement the CCM</p>		
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
