
# Written Statements at EB154



# Co-Sponsorship of Decisions/Resolutions



- Proposed decisions/resolutions are prepared as conference papers
- Conference papers include co-sponsors on the document
- The most efficient way to confirm co-sponsorship is for the Member States who submit draft resolutions include a list of co-sponsors and then copy all co-sponsors on their email to [governanceunit@who.int](mailto:governanceunit@who.int) when making their submission – **by 12 January 2024**
- It is also possible to confirm cosponsorship by emailing [cosponsorship@who.int](mailto:cosponsorship@who.int)
- Once decision/resolution text is submitted, the text goes into production (editing for WHO house style, translation, posting online) after which time co-sponsorship can be announced from the floor when the item is discussed
- Conference papers are temporary documents; co-sponsoring from the floor during the discussion will be noted in the permanent records

# Interpretation for both EB154 and PBAC39
