

Preparation for the high-level meeting of the United Nations General Assembly on universal health coverage

Draft decision proposed by Australia, Bangladesh, Brazil, Canada, China, Egypt, European Union and its 27 Member States, Israel, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico, Philippines, Switzerland, Thailand, Timor-Leste, United Kingdom, United States of America and Vanuatu

The Executive Board, having considered the report on re-orienting health systems to primary health care as a resilient foundation for universal health coverage, ¹

Decided to recommend to the Seventy-sixth World Health Assembly the adoption of the following resolution:

The Seventy-sixth World Health Assembly.

(PP1) Reaffirming the right of every human being, without distinction of any kind, to the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of physical and mental health;

(PP2) Recalling United Nations General Assembly resolution 701 (2015) on transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, resolutions WHA72.4 (2019) on preparation for the high-level meeting of the United Nations General Assembly on universal health coverage and WHA72.2 (2019) on primary health care, United Nations General Assembly resolution 742 (2019) on the political declaration of the high-level meeting on universal health coverage, and United Nations General Assembly resolution 75315 (2021) on scope, modalities, format and organization of the high-level meeting on universal health coverage;

(PP3) Recognizing that the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development acknowledges the need to achieve universal health coverage and access to quality health care, and further recognizing that vital contribution of universal health coverage is fundamental for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) related not only to health and well-being, but also to other socio-economic development and recognizing that achievement of the SDGs is critical for







Before requesting a visa support letter, participants are advised to contact their nearest Swiss embassy or consulate to determine whether they require a visa:

Travel expense reimbursement

World Health Assembly:

In accordance with resolution WHA50.1 (1997), special consideration will be given to delegates whose countries are classified as least developed countries by the United Nations. WHO will cover the cost of an economy/tourist airfare by the most direct route to Geneva for one delegate of such countries. However, following the rules set forth by the World Health Assembly, WHO will not be able to provide per diem or any other non-airfare expenditures. Reimbursement will be made in Geneva, upon presentation of the air ticket and the invoice. The process of reimbursement takes at least 24 hours therefore requests made after Thursday, 30 May (mid-day) will not be taken into consideration.

Executive Board and PBAC members:

Two options:

- to make their own travel arrangements and be reimbursed travel expenses in accordance with entitlements, by bank transfer or
- to make travel arrangements through Carlson Wagonlit, the WHO official travel agent. If using Carlson Wagonlit, reservations must be made by sending an email with the required travel dates to whomgt.ch@contactcwt.com indicating "EB155 June 2024" in the subject title. Reservations can be made with Carlson Wagonlit as from Wednesday, 8 May 2024. Initial/tentative reservations made with another travel agent would not be able to be used.


