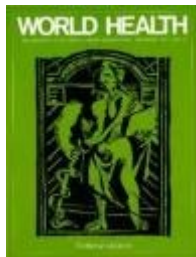
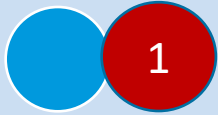

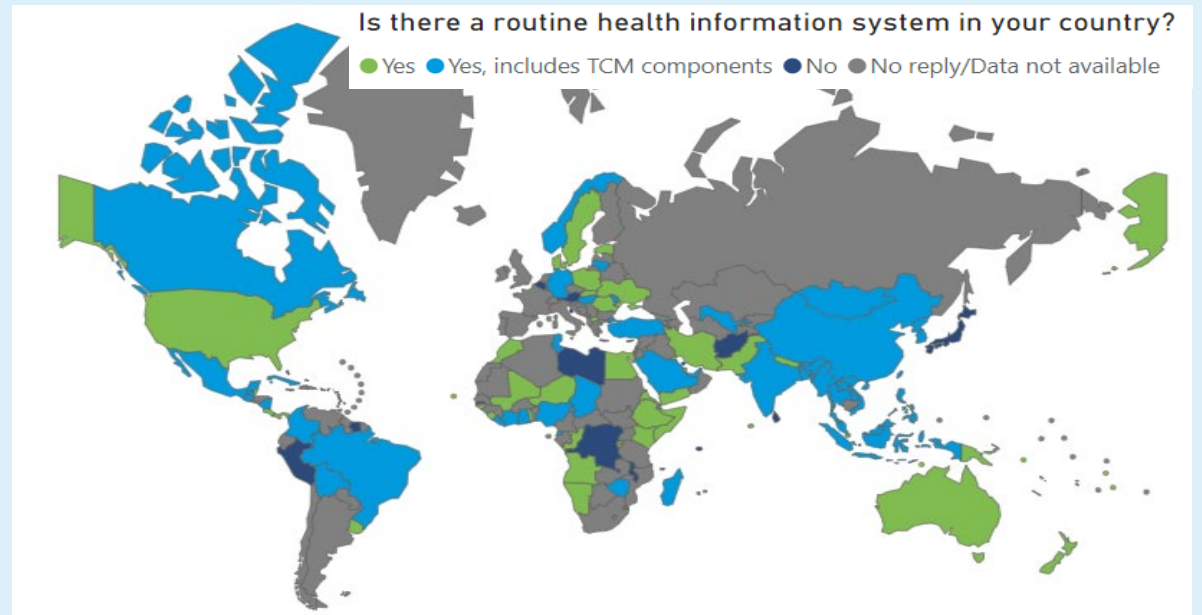
# WHA76(20) in May 2023: **WHO strategy on traditional medicine**

## Decided to request the Director-General:

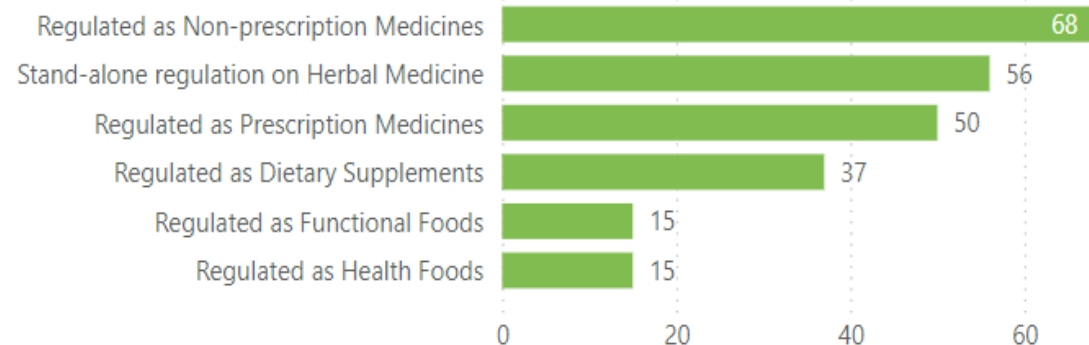
- 1 to extend the WHO traditional medicine strategy: 2014–2023 until 2025;
- 2 to develop, guided by the WHO traditional medicine strategy: 2014 - 2023 and in consultation with Member States and relevant stakeholders, a **draft new global traditional medicine strategy for the period 2025 - 2034** and to submit the strategy for consideration by the Seventy-eighth World Health Assembly in 2025, through the Executive Board at its 156th session

# Global TCIM landscape (3rd Global Survey in 2023)

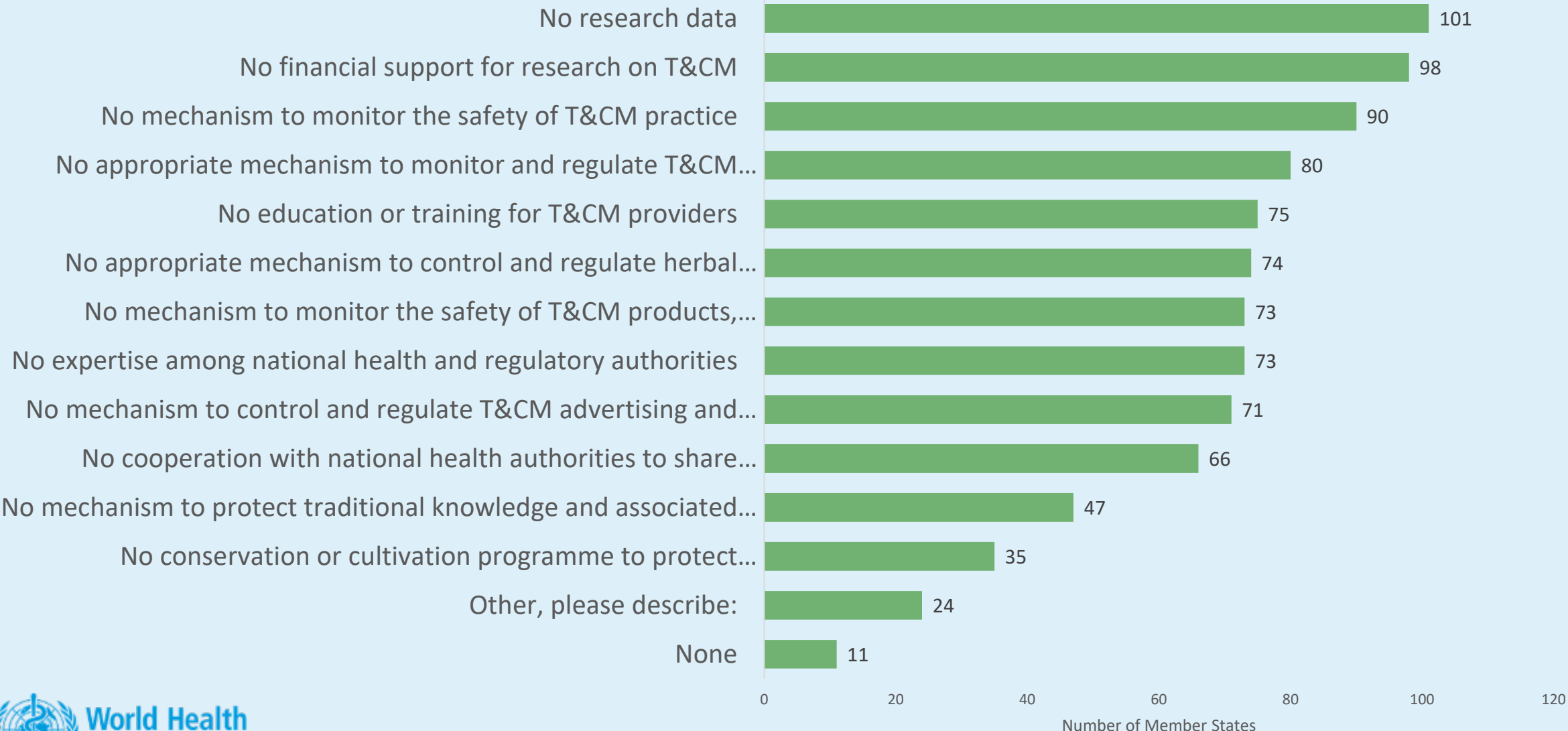
- ❑ Policy: 90 Member States

## WHO Traditional Medicine Strategy: 2025 – 2034

### Traditional Medicine (TM)

- Sum total of the **knowledge, skill and practices** based on the theories, beliefs and experiences of different cultures as well as **scientific and professional expertise**, used in the diagnosis, the prevention and treatment of illness and to promote health and well-being.

### Complementary Medicine (CM)

- It is used **interchangeably** for “**traditional medicine**” in some countries, refers to a broad set of health care practices that are not part of a country’s **mainstream medicine**, and plays a **supportive role in health care**.

### Integrative Medicine (IM)

- It is an **interdisciplinary** and **evidence-based approach** aimed at achieving **whole-person** health and well-being by using a **combination** or fusion of biomedical, and traditional and/or complementary medical knowledge, skills and practices; provides **holistic care** spanning the care continuum; and may involve various health care providers and institutions.

## Objectives

1. Optimize the **cross-sector value** of TCIM and empower communities through inclusive approaches.
2. Strengthen the **evidence base** for TCIM.
3. Support the provision of quality and safe TCIM through appropriate **regulatory mechanisms**.
4. **Integrate** TCIM into health systems to support the achievement of UHC.

# Four strategic objectives and nine strategic directions

## Strategic Objective 1

Optimize the cross-sector value of TCIM and empower communities through inclusive approaches.

### Direction 1.1:

Include TCIM in **cross-sector policies and action plans** for health, well-being societies, One Health and SDGs.

### Direction 1.2:

Develop **inclusive approaches and models** for the protection, access and benefit-sharing of TMK.

### Direction 1.3:

Support **informed choices** of the public with respect to safe and effective TCIM use and self-care.



## Strategic Objective 2

Strengthen the evidence base for TCIM.

### Direction 2.1:

Facilitate **high-quality** TCIM research through increased resource allocation.

### Direction 2.2:

Explore the most **appropriate research approach** and maximize the rational utilization of technology for TCIM.

## Strategic Objective 3

Support the provision of quality and safe TCIM through appropriate regulatory mechanisms.

### Direction 3.1:

Provide appropriate regulatory mechanisms for **TCIM products** that are sustainably produced and supplied.

### Direction 3.2:

Provide appropriate regulatory mechanisms for **TCIM practices and practitioners**.

## Strategic Objective 4

Integrate TCIM into health systems to support the achievement of UHC.

### Direction 4.1:

Incorporate TCIM into national and subnational **health-related frameworks and policies** for the integration of safe and effective TCIM into health systems.

### Direction 4.2:

Facilitate the **integration** of safe and effective TCIM into health systems and services across the care continuum and life course.
