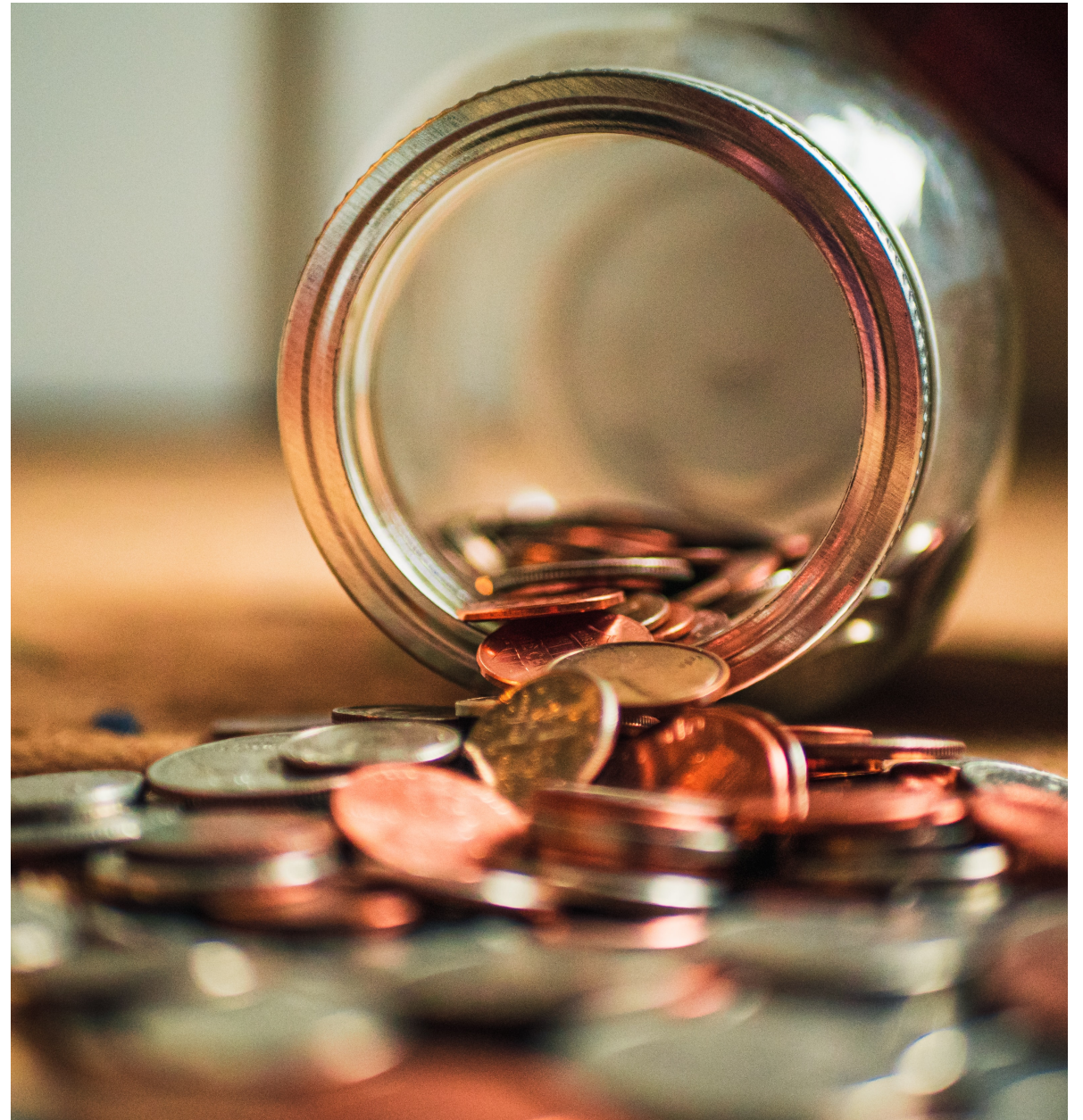

A Fiscal Note is a:

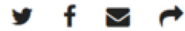
- Statutorily required;

- Estimate of direct impact;
- Available to the public.



Missouri witness protection fund headed to Gov. Parson after senate approval

A bill to create a witness protection fund is on its way to Gov. Mike Parson's desk after unanimous approval by the Missouri Senate Wednesday.

That measure is one of several aimed at addressing violent crime, the subject of the special session called by Parson in late July.

The fund would be run by the Department of Safety, and money would be disbursed to law enforcement agencies to provide security for witnesses and their families "before, during and after criminal trials," said Sen. Tony Luetkemeyer of Parkville, who sponsored the legislation.

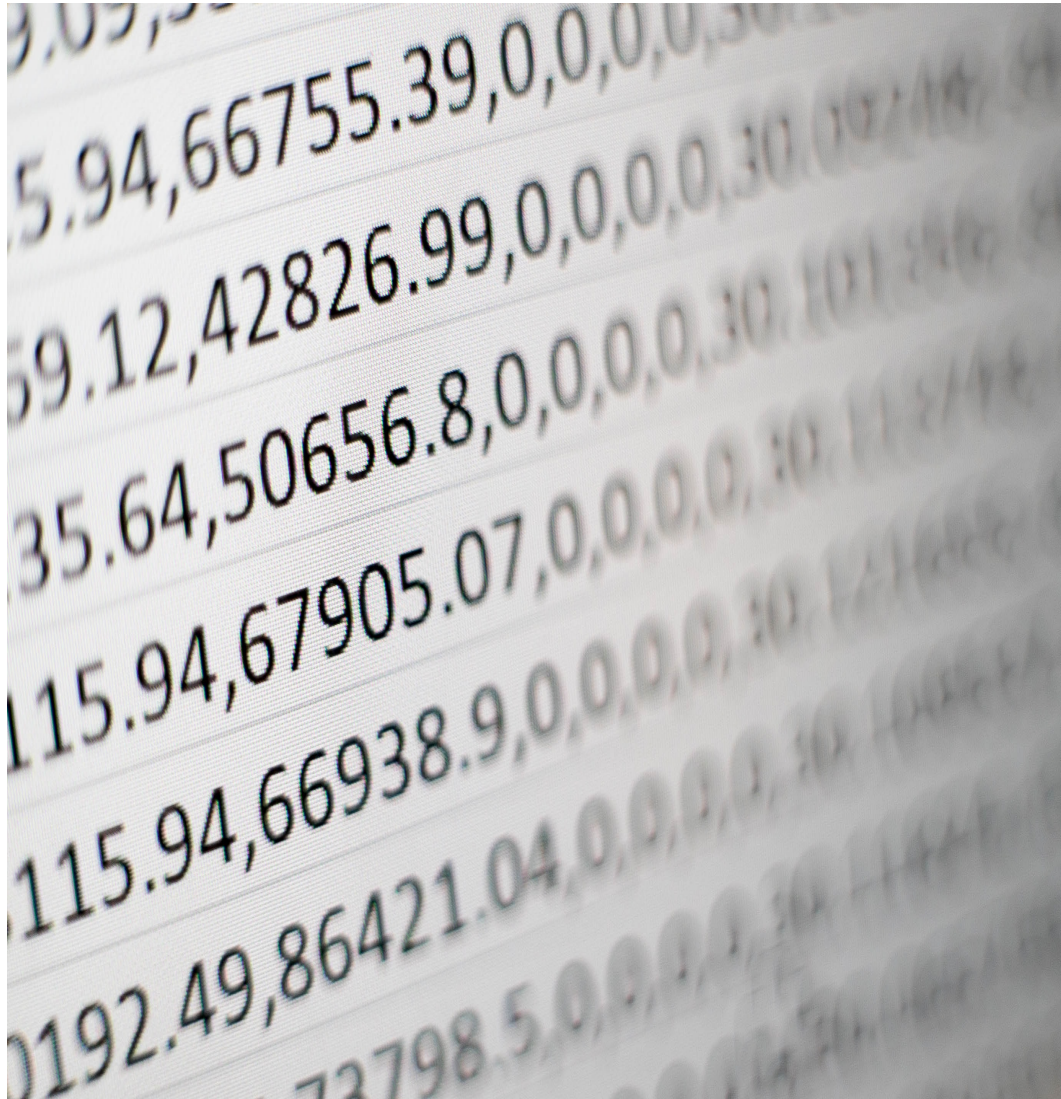
"Far too often, suspects charged with violent crimes walk free because witnesses are afraid to cooperate," Luetkemeyer said.

"This is a fear that no one should have to live with, especially when they can bring violent criminals to justice."

The House [approved the bill](#) last week. But exactly how the program would be financed remains unclear. The bill's fiscal note indicates that the fiscal impact of the program is slightly over \$1 million for the first three years.

Fiscal Notes are an important part of the legislative process. Fiscal Notes are used:

- By Legislators during floor debate and hearings;
- By Agencies and Appropriation staff during the budget process;
- By news entities when reporting on proposed legislation;
- By the Public.



Fiscal Notes are not:

- Estimates of indirect or induced effects;
- Budget requests or appropriation amounts;
- Opinions on the merits of proposed policies;
- Error proof or unalterable.

Response Time

Most due dates are tentative and can change based on where the bill is at in the legislative process.

How often Are Fiscal Notes needed?

Fiscal Notes are needed at various stages of the legislative process:

- Before a bill is heard in a hearing
- When a bill is reported out of committee
- When a bill is Perfected
- When a bill is amended
- When a bill is Truly Agreed To and Finally Passed

Responses that work

County A would realize a savings of \$1,600 if this proposed legislation were to pass.

County B assumes additional staff may cost between \$2,000 and \$5,000 to complete assessments at an earlier date.

County C assumes this proposal will cost \$95,000 annually for two added field appraisers to complete increases over 15% and provide written notification.

Example of a Good Response

As an example, one property has a value of \$75.7 Million. According to this new law, the value of the property would decrease to \$52.99 Million after one year and continue to decrease down to \$26.495 Million after 11 years. The tax losses from this one property would be \$712,316.

Demonstrated the impact using an example.

We do not have a comprehensive listing that shows properties with solar panels or systems; it is not a searchable item in our system. The best estimate is that the total City losses would be anywhere from 5 to 10 times as much as the loss on the referenced building.

Discussed limitations of the estimate.

The new language states, "Any real or tangible personal property associated with a project that uses solar energy directly to generate electricity shall continue in subsequent years to have the depreciation percentage last listed in the appropriate column in the table."

Identified the language driving the change.

This can be interpreted that any real property structure that generates electricity (house, commercial building, garage, etc.) will be valued by a depreciation schedule instead of market value. That will cause loss in value and taxes, conflicting statutes and may be unconstitutional as well.

Described the key assumption.



Elements of A Good Response

- Identify key assumptions
- Identify the impacts by section number
- Itemize each impact
- Include historical trends or experiences
- Quantify the impact, use examples
- Provide supporting data

Other Types of Responses

Comment Memo

The Comment Memo can be used to express concerns or suggest changes related to the proposed legislation. The comment memo will be forwarded to the drafter of the legislation.

- Moving responsibility to another entity
- Unfunded Mandate
- Improve wording to eliminate confusion

Technical Memo

A Technical Memo can be used to identify technical errors in the drafting of the proposed legislation such as bad sectional references or conflicting sections. Technical Memos are also forwarded to the drafter.

- Misspellings
- Wrong effective year
- Incorrect sectional reference

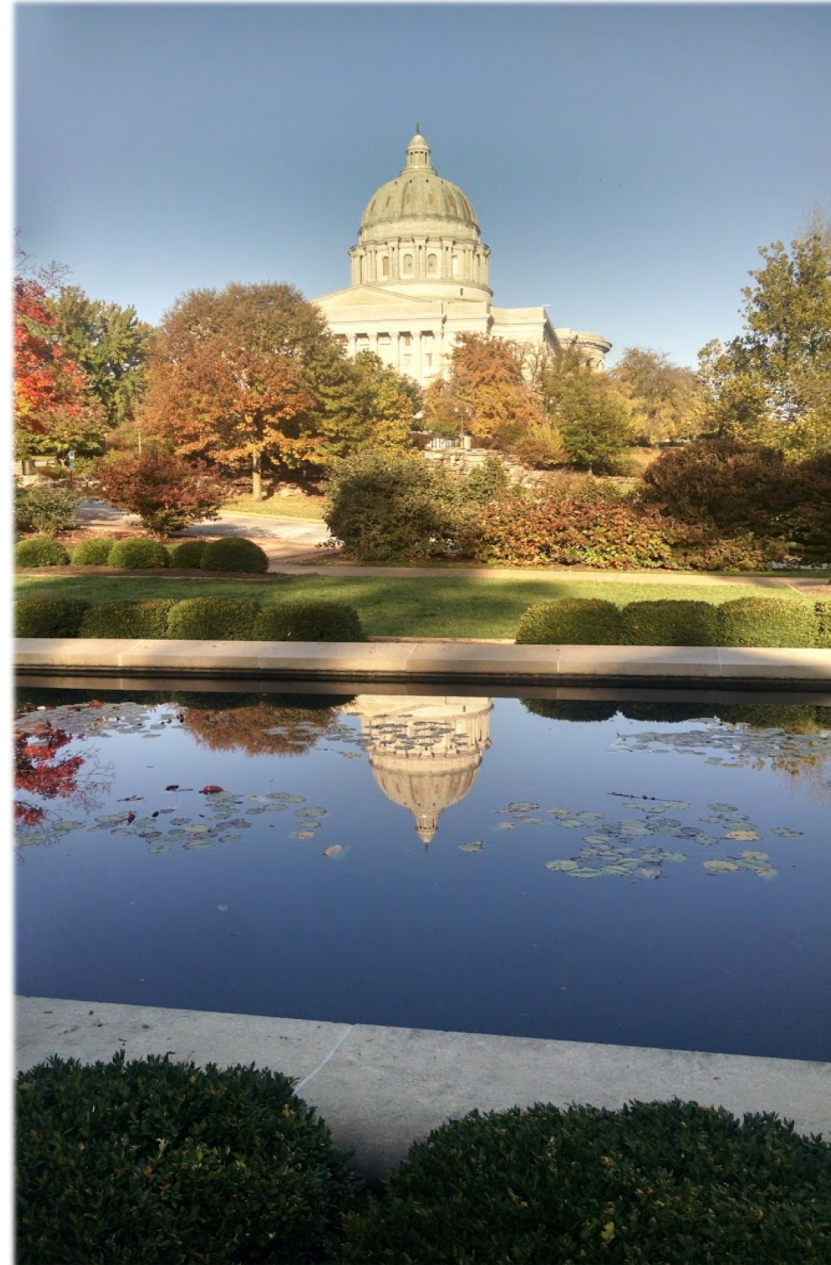

Current Bill Summary

HCS/SB 676 - This act modifies several provisions relating to taxation.

PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENTS

Current law requires the St. Louis County Assessor to conduct a physical inspection of residential real property prior to increasing the assessed valuation of a property by more than fifteen percent since the last assessment, and requires written notification of such inspection. This amendment applies such provision to all counties. (Section 137.115)

This provision is identical to a provision contained in HCS/SS#2/SB 704 (2020) and SB 579 (2020), and is substantially similar to a provision contained in HCS/SS/SCS/SB 570 (2020) and HB 1710 (2020).

For property tax assessments and appeals of such assessments, current law provides that, in first class counties, taxpayers shall appeal to the county board of equalization by the third Monday in June and the county board of equalization shall meet on the first Monday in July. This act modifies such deadlines to provided that taxpayers shall appeal to the county board of equalization by the second Monday in July, and the county board of equalization shall meet on the third Monday in July. (Sections 137.385 and 138.090)

This provision is identical to a provision contained in HCS/SS/SCS/SB 570 (2020) and HB 1710 (2020), and is similar to a provision contained in HCS/SS#2/SB 704 (2020).
