

Planned Parenthood Votes Colorado compiles legislative scorecards to educate and inform voters about the record of support for reproductive health of current members of the Colorado General Assembly. The information presented is based on votes on key legislation related to reproductive health and rights.



ANTI-CHOICE

This year, we saw an unprecedented number of attacks on reproductive health care. However, with the help of our coalition partners, we **defeated all six** anti-choice bills. *These attacks included:*

- HB-1041: This bill would have made abortion illegal in Colorado, seeking to make it a class 3 felony. This bill was introduced just three months after Coloradans voted down a fetal personhood initiative in the midterm elections.
- HB-1112: Although claiming to protect infants, this bill would have criminalized doctors providing care to women who face complications in their pregnancy and those who receive late-term abortion care.
- HB-1128: This bill, like others passed in states where the majority of abortion clinics have been closed, would have created targeted regulations of abortion providers (TRAP) in Colorado. It sought to put unnecessary regulations on facilities that provide abortion services, with the goal of restricting access to abortion services.
- HB-1162: This bill would have created barriers to safe abortion services, under the guise of banning sex-selective abortions. It would have encouraged racial profiling and distrust in the patient provider relationship.
- SB-268: This bill would have inserted fetal personhood language into Colorado's statutes, thereby potentially allowing prosecution for abortion services or personal losses of pregnancy by women, such as miscarriages.
- SB-285: This bill would have required Colorado doctors to provide biased counseling and forced ultrasounds, as well the creation of a 24-hour waiting period before providing any abortion service in Colorado.



ANTI-EQUALITY

During the 2015 session, we also saw two bills that would have allowed discrimination based on personal religious beliefs. Both failed.

- HB-1161: This bill would have undermined Colorado's Anti-Discrimination Act, by allowing certain business owners to pick and choose which customers they serve.
- HB-1171: This "right to discriminate" bill would have allowed Colorado businesses to refuse services or benefits to certain people, like bosses refusing their employees' access to birth control in their health plans and refusing to serve LGBT Coloradans.



ANTI-COMPREHENSIVE SEX EDUCATION AND MINOR'S RIGHTS

During the 2015 session, there was a bill introduced to undermine minors' rights to access important information, counseling and health services. The bill failed.

- SB-77: Under the guise of protecting "parental rights," this bill would have created a litany of barriers for minors in receiving help from a trusted adult, teacher, or healthcare provider.



WOMEN'S HEALTH

During the 2015 session, there were two bills seeking to expand access to birth control and pregnancy prevention counseling for Colorado teens. Both unfortunately failed.

- HB-1079: This bill would have continued and expanded a successful program that provides Medicaid reimbursement for counseling of teens to prevent pregnancy and dropping out of school.
- HB-1194: This bill would have allowed general fund dollars to continue a successful program that provides long acting and reversible contraception to young women in Colorado.
