Dear Mrs. Bevel

I am writing to tell you what happen the day we picketed on the post office steps, as you know we were talking about it in Mr. Cobb while we were having trial down there. So we decided to do as a test example in Jackson on the second.

Megar Eucers took us down there and when we got out of his care the signs were in a package and after we went inside we unfold them and took them out. Then went to the porch and started, after about fifteen min. A City Cop was standing across the street, then two more came, then a few minutes more they came over and told us to move on and I told them they did not have any jurisdiction over federal property. Then I told them they better check before they arrest us then they started talking among themselves. Then one went inside and brought a man out there then he began



to tell us to get on the sidewalk to do that but we did  
not pay any attention to him. After we had picket for about  
45 minutes and broke the record for picket the proddy  
way you came up and a head police name Armstrong said  
Get them! Get them down! That when we were arrested  
and took to the City Jail and booked, what do you think  
about this? Was this test successful or not? what  
do you think my next step should be? Mr. Donbrosti from  
New Orleans sent \$15.00 for 3 of our Bound and I say all paid  
pete pound. How is thing in and around Cleveland?  
Any any body working on Voter Registration up there?

I sure did hate when I got out to hear of  
Tom going to the Army.
