Dear Mr. Waskow:

We received your letter of October 16th and are very much interested in planning a trip to Washington for the participants in the Work-Study Project. It would be impossible for us to suggest any definite dates at this time, but we think that sometime in the Spring would be desirable if we can overcome other difficulties present.

We are having a problem now with funds. The grant from the Field Foundation only allows for ten scholarships to Tougaloo next year and \$5,000.00 to cover the expenses of having instruction from some of the Tougaloo faculty. Expenses for the Voter-Registration part of the project in addition to food, housing, and special trips <sup>not be</sup> taken care of by SNCC, which means that we must depend on contributions which we hope will come from interested persons.

Therefore, our lack of funds limits us at this time and makes it impossible for us to make such commitments as the trip to Washington unless we know for sure that the expenses will come from a definite source.

We are glad that you are impressed with the plans for the project and welcome any suggestions you might have for its implementation, since it is very much experimental at this point.
