Dear Mr. Owens:

The U.S. Dept. of Justice, Northern District of Mississippi is threatening to bring suit against me because I can't pay a debt to the Federal Housing Administration based upon my income from the P.O. Dept. as of April 1954. As long as I was working my regular 35 hr. schedule I kept up the payments, but since the P.O. Dept. has cut my hours to sixteen and then up to twenty-two, I don't have enough to live on not to think of paying an old bill.

There was an agreement between the Dept. of Justice and my self that I would pay five dollars a month and that worked alright until they got a new Att. General in the Northern District of Mississippi. I wish you could do one of two things: (1) Get my hours increased ( which the new Postmaster is willing to do I think ) or (2) get the Justice Dept. to allow me to pay ~~\$200~~ each month. I wish you would talk to Mr. H.M. Ray, U.S. Attorney-Oxford, Mississippi.
