We were all so happy that you could find time to come to Fitzgerald to help us in our drive here for the mainstream of human
dignity. I think the walls of segregation were moved back and integration became more of a reality to everyone, because of the workshop's effect.

You know, one always has afterthoughts when cleaning up after a workshop. In reflection, one asks himself "Now what did we de-er what didn't we de." And this leads one to a realization of what is needed the most in the community, of all the suggestions discussed. We are very much in need of a building-a freedom building. This building would not be used to house freedom workers, but as a place for meetings of various natures. As was pointed up in the workshop discussions, the community needs more communications and co-eperation, more discussions and information services. A freedom house would serve thesefunctions providing a forum for our organizational planning and discussion of local problems. Now that land has been given to us, all that remains is to begin the planning for this much-needed project.

Since you have been here—and seen the situation at first-hand, we hope you will share the feelings we have about the need for the freedem house. Will you help us to raise the money to do this building? We have a little money to add to the general fund, to finance this "dream of ours."

Thank you for any and all assistance given. And again, we want you to know how much your presence at the Workshop added to its success.
