

Sunday, Aug. 15: Went to church at Mt. Zion (Corville). This was the first time I had been to this church; was received very friendly-ly. Also present were members of the Quaker project who are working on the Community Center.

Monday, Aug. 16: Campaigned for a workshop to be held at St. Paul's Church on the election (referendum), then held the workshop myself. Went to revival at St. Paul's that night.

Tuesday, Aug. 17: Spent the day poll-watching at Cameron Community Center. There were no Negro voters. About 1 PM a deputy came by and told me I couldn't stay in the room where balloting was taking place. He said I should wait outside. Since I wasn't sure of the legalities involved, I complied.

Wednesday, Aug. 18: Andrew Green came by in the morning and told us that school enrollment would be this Friday, and that people going to Washington D.C. had to be in Jackson on Saturday for orientation. Spent the rest of the day cycling around trying to dig up a car; no luck. Due to night coming sooner than I'd expected, spent the night at J.D. Phillips'.

Thursday, Aug. 19: Cycled into Precinct 10 to see about getting up a meeting for schools. Also, since I hadn't been here before, I wanted to get to know the local leadership. Discovered that the area is being worked from Canton for the schools. Found out in the morning, via the Madison County Herald, that Green was mistaken about schools.

Friday, Aug. 20: Green insisted he was right about the schools. So I and James McCullough (?) (local person) set out on bikes to check. Arrived at Velma Jackson High School (Negro) and found no one there. Tried to go to a precinct meeting at Pleasant Green, but it had been cancelled.

Saturday, August 21: Went in to Canton for the Movement meeting.

Sunday, August 22: Went over to Pleasant Green and spoke at a mission meeting about the trip to D.C. The local leadership is organizing some fund-raising events for the trip. Then went canvassing out Highway 43 about schools.
