Dear Lucy:

I have been cleaning out my desk in preparation for my departure from Arkansas. I found a note from you saying that you could supply us with a few copies of A Manual for Direct Action. If you would send about six copies, c/o Drew Blackwell (a very efficeint young man who is taking over my job) at this address, we would appreciate it very much.

Also, in regard to the trip we made, visiting the different centers: I have the list of supplies we made, but I couldn't remember if you wanted me to make up a 'budget' and then ask you for some money or whether you wanted to send me some money for the supplies, and then I would tell you where it went. If you would like a list of things to be bought and their cost, then I will ask Drew to make it up for you as soon as he gets back from a convention and a visit home. This means that he would not be able to do anything on it until the second week in Sept. But this might be a good idea, because it looks as if the needs of the centers might be changing some, now that school is starting. For example, the plates are still needed in Gould, and the Dumas center will continue to operate, but the Stuttgart one may be shut down indefinitely due to the unexpected return of a SNCC worker (Isaac Allen) to Portland, & due to family problems. Except for the continuing needs in Gould, and the need for paper for the school board campaigns, I recommend that you send Drew a letter asking him to send you a list of needs in Sept. I will also give him the list that we made up when you were here.

What are your plans for the winter? Are you going to teach, or was that just a day-dream? Between Sept. 5 and January, 1966, I can be reached at c/o Sociology Department, Brandeis University, Waltham, Mass.

Thanks for everything. You've really done a lot for our project. I hope you have the feeling that it's done some good, which I think it has.
