# **Selection of Oral Health Training Modules for Medical Providers**

Sustainability of oral health integration requires the implementation of processes and protocols to onboard and train new staff and providers. The following online curriculum options are recommended to enhance provider knowledge related to tooth decay, oral health risk assessment, oral health anticipatory guidance, and fluoride varnish application. As part of the TOHF project, HealthEfficient's team will advise Partnering Health Centers on utilization of a Learning Management Platform to monitor and track provider training in the subject area of preventive oral health services.

## Open Wide: Oral Health Training for Health Professionals

A series of modules designed to help health professionals working in community settings promote oral health for infants, children and their families.

- Module 1: **Tooth Decay** (~20 minutes)
  - o Reviews the biological causes of tooth decay and its physical and psychological effects on infants and children.

#### Smiles for Life: A National Oral Health Curriculum

A curriculum consisting of multiple modules covering core areas of oral health relevant to primary care health professionals. (1 CME credit per module for Physicians, Medical Assistants, Nurses, Pharmacists, Physician Assistants, and Dentists)

- Child Oral Health (~60 minutes)
  - o Addresses the prevalence, etiology, and consequences of early childhood caries.

### Maryland's Mouths Matter: Maryland Required Training

This series of four modules is designed to provide Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) medical providers and other health providers with knowledge needed to reduce the incidence of dental caries among children ages 5 and under and to contribute to the establishment of a dental home.

- Module 1: The Role of Medical Providers (~10 minutes)
  - o Discusses the important role that medical providers and staff can plan in children's oral health.

### HealthCheck Fluoride Varnish Training: District of Columbia Required Training

The application of fluoride varnish for children under 3 by a trained DC HealthCheck primary care provider is a reimbursable dental/oral health procedure. In order to receive Medicaid reimbursement, primary care providers must complete the fluoride varnish training offered through DC HealthCheck. HealthCheck training must be up to date before you can access and take the fluoride varnish training. **CME credits** available at completion of training.
