- RWD review for the Firebaugh WWTF and letter notifying the discharger that the RWD is incomplete and further information is required.

In addition to the above, Katie is always available to help coworkers, and often interacts with dischargers and the public. She conducts each of those interactions in a respectful and professional manner and provides timely and succinct responses to all. Recently, she was praised by a member of the public during a phone conversation discussing comments for upcoming WDRs.
